**SPECIFIC RULES FOR GARDEN FLOWER EXHIBITS**

1. The rules printed herein and the flower show general rules are made a part of the conditions under which all entries of exhibitors are made, and exhibitors are respectfully requested to read them carefully, thereby avoiding confusion at the time of the Fair and to ensure that all entries are in the appropriate class.
2. Exhibits will be judged on basis of scale of points from Judging Manual of Men's Garden Clubs of America, as follows:
 

Color .....	15
Condition .....	10
Foliage .....	10
Form .....	25
Size .....	20
Stem .....	<u>20</u>
<b>Total</b> .....	<b>100</b>
3. Exhibitors are permitted two entries in each class, provided the second entry is plainly a different variety and is so labeled on the entry tag.
4. Classes may be subdivided into additional classes if the number of entries of any one flower exceed three.
5. Flowers will be placed in Sections. All blue ribbon winners in a class will be judged for Section Ribbon. All 9 (nine) Section Winners will be judged for placement on Court of Honor. Ribbons to be awarded for Princess, Queen, King of Show from the Section Winners.
6. Roses, Dahlias, Gladiolus and African Violets, Hostas and other Gesneriads may not be entered in this Show. They are provided for in other shows.
7. Other things being equal, judges will award prizes to named over unnamed varieties.
8. The decision of the judges is final.
