### **NEW YORK STATE-ORIGIN CATTLE**

1. A valid intrastate CVI (AI-61) is required. The CVI must be issued on or after May 1st of the current year.
2. All cattle have official identification. All cattle must be identified by an official USDA radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tag, commonly referred to as an “840 RFID tag” or equivalent official RFID tag if the animal was tagged in another country.
3. Rabies vaccination is required for all species for which there is a USDA licensed vaccine available (cattle, horses, sheep, dog, cat, ferret) and that are 4 months of age or older on the date of admission to the fair. For most rabies vaccines, the earliest age allowable for primary vaccination is 3 months (12 weeks). Animals that are vaccinated prior to 84 days of age will need to be re-vaccinated according to

label before entering the fairgrounds. Vaccine must have been administered within the past 12 months. The rabies vaccination requirement must be met on the day of admission even if the animal was previously admitted to a fair when too young to vaccinate. The New York State Fair requires rabies vaccination for all livestock species entering the grounds. See Section F for “Acceptable Proof of Rabies Vaccination.”

4. All cattle exhibited at NY county fairs, or the New York State Fair must be negative to an approved test appropriate to detect Bovine Viral Diarrhea persistent infection (BVD-PI). Official ID must be in the animal prior to sampling. The testing veterinarian is responsible for making sure the proper test is conducted. This is a once in a lifetime test that must be reported on the required certificate of veterinary inspection. The issuing veterinarian is responsible for verifying the validity of the test, existing official identification of the animal, and recording the test date on the CVI. If a previous test or official identification is not verifiable, the test must be repeated.

5. All cattle must be vaccinated against bovine respiratory disease complex including bovine respiratory syncytial virus, bovine virus diarrhea, infectious bovine rhinotracheitis and parainfluenza with an age appropriate- product administered in a manner and time frame adequate to confer protective immunity for these diseases for the duration of the fair. The date and vaccine product must be documented.

#### ***OUT-OF-STATE CATTLE***

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) is required for out-of-state cattle. All animals entering New York State must satisfy both import requirements and fair requirements for that species and be accompanied by a valid interstate CVI. The interstate CVI is valid for 30 days from the date of CVI inspection. During the New York fair season (July 1 through Labor Day) valid CVIs can be used multiple times for entrance into a qualifying NYS Agricultural Fair (linked here) (<https://www.nyfairs.org/>) The initial entrance into a qualifying NYS Agricultural Fair must be within 30 days of the date of CVI inspection. The name of the fair must be recorded on the CVI. For the CVI to be used for a later fair, it must be dated and initialed by a NYS Agriculture and Markets official noting the location of the initial, qualifying NYS Agricultural Fair. A change in health status or eligibility of an animal necessitates the generation of a new CVI. New York does not participate in the New England Exhibition Show and Fair Circuit. 2. All cattle have official identification. All cattle must be identified by an official USDA radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tag, commonly referred to as an “840 RFID tag” or equivalent official RFID tag if the animal was tagged in another country. 3. Rabies vaccination is required for all species for which there is a USDA licensed vaccine available (cattle, horses, sheep, dog, cat, ferret) and that are 4 months of age or older on the date of admission to the fair. For most rabies vaccines, the earliest age allowable for primary vaccination is 3 months (12 weeks). Animals that are vaccinated prior to 84 days of age will need

to be re-vaccinated according to label before entering the fairgrounds. Vaccine must have been administered within the past 12 months. If a previous test or official identification is not verifiable, the test must be repeated.

5. All cattle must be vaccinated against bovine respiratory disease complex including bovine respiratory syncytial virus, bovine virus diarrhea, infectious bovine rhinotracheitis and parainfluenza with an age appropriate- product administered in a manner and time frame adequate to confer protective immunity for these diseases for the duration of the fair. The date and vaccine product should be documented.

### **General Reminders**

- All animals must have legible tattoos upon arrival at the Great New York State Fair.
- The Superintendents of Beef Cattle are authorized and empowered to cause the removal from the buildings and grounds of all animals failing to meet the health conditions herein specified.
- If you are treating an animal for any reason, please inform the Superintendents.
- It is required that you bring the original health papers with you for inspection upon arrival at the Great New York State Fairgrounds.
- If health papers and registration papers are not correctly completed or are missing information you will not be allowed to stay and show.
- All registration papers must be original certificate, no copies. An exhibitor is the owner(s) or firm appearing on the registration paper for the entry at closing date.
- The Great New York State Fair will comply with the rules of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions relative to banning nurse cows for beef cattle from the Fairgrounds. The rule states: “Be it resolved that the Livestock Committee of the I.A.F.E. recommends that effective July 1, 1967, all member fairs and expositions discontinue providing space for nurse cows for beef cattle, both breeding cattle and steers, in open and junior shows.

### **Rules, Regulations, & Reminders**

#### **Arrival, Delivery & Release Procedure**

1. All Beef Cattle enter gate #7, follow perimeter road until you come to staging area under the overpass. Attendants will direct you when you can proceed. Vet check at barn then unload. You have 20 minutes to unload. Proceed back down Belle Isle Rd. and exit Gate #11, then follow signs to Horse/Livestock Parking in Black Lot.
2. All trailers must be parked in the Black Lot. Apart from trailers participating in Supreme Tuesday Sept 1, 2026.

3. Truckers and campers be aware of changes of entry around the cattle barn. All trucks will be going in the same direction to alleviate the congestion in the barn area. ENTER BARN BY GATE 10, EXIT BY MANURE PIT.
4. Exhibitors will not be permitted to arrive at the barn before your scheduled time, please refer to the Schedule for your rotations scheduled time.
5. There will be a staged area under the bridge. Barn workers will be directing trailers when to proceed to the barn. After Vet Check, Exhibitors will have 20 minutes to unload tack. Vehicles will not be allowed to park along entrance and exit driveways or in the interior of the fairgrounds.
6. ALL REGISTRATION PAPERS MUST BE ORIGINAL CERTIFICATE – NO COPIES! Upon arrival on the Fairgrounds all exhibitors must have original HEALTH papers and REGISTRATION papers readily available.
7. All cattle will be checked as they come off the trailers or trucks.
8. Cattle will not be allowed in the barn, on the wash rack or tie-out area until the State Vet and the office checks them in.
9. The superintendents will work with exhibitors to schedule a release time during each rotation; the release dates are set in the schedule. **You are not permitted to leave until they have given you the approval to move out.**

### ***Camping***

**Rotation 1:** 8a Tuesday August 25<sup>th</sup> 2026 thru 11a Saturday August 29<sup>th</sup> 2026

**Rotation 2 :** 11p Saturday August 29<sup>th</sup> 2026 thru 11a Wednesday September 2<sup>nd</sup> 2026

**Rotation 3:** 11p Wednesday September 2<sup>nd</sup> 2026 thru 11a Monday September 7<sup>th</sup> 2026

Tan Camping is limited to exhibitors. You will receive an email after registering in our entry process containing details regarding how you can reserve a camping location. Locations are limited, so the sooner you register on-line, the better chance you will have of getting one. Please review the camping site size before booking your spot.

10. Tent camping is not permitted by the Great New York State Fair
11. Each Tan Camping Spot will allow for one tow vehicle to park; this vehicle will be required to stay within the grounds between 8:30am and 11:30p with the exception of move in and move out times.
12. Your camper should be centered on the designated camping space number. Your tow vehicle should be parked either pulled-in or backed-in. You must not encroach on the assigned space of another guest with your RV, pushouts, pop-ups, awnings, grills or furniture in any direction. The Great New York State Fair management are the sole arbitrators of whether a vehicle extends beyond space. If determined that the RV exceeds the dimensions on the RV application, you will be relocated or removed from the property. Please note, relocation is not always an option. Plan accordingly.

## **Entry**

Entry deadline is Monday August 3, 2026. No late entries will be accepted after August 4, 2026

13. Competition is not limited to New York State.
14. Entries are to be completed online at <https://nysfair.ny.gov/competitions/how-to-enter/>
15. All applications for INDIVIDUAL AND GROUP entries for Beef Cattle must be received on or before the closing date of August 3, 2026. No entries will be accepted after AUGUST 4, 2026
16. Substitutions within and between classes will be allowed except where stated otherwise by the Breed Association. These must be presented to the Superintendent or Assistant by 9:00 am the day after arrival.
17. An entry fee of \$6 will be charged for each individual animal and group class. Entry fee must be paid at time of making application. The fee is not considered a stall fee. Due to limited housing facilities, stalls will be allotted by the judgment of the superintendent or the assistant.
18. There will be no class changes after the show book as gone to the printer. Only clerical errors Substitutions will be corrected. No additions. 4-H and Youth Must be pre-entered.

## **Exhibitor**

19. Beef Cattle Show Management reminds all exhibitors that the minimum legal drinking age is 21. They urge any exhibitor(s) hosting a post-show party to closely monitor their guests for the legal age requirement. The management reminds exhibitors that they may be liable in case of accident(s) and recommends that any post-show party be conducted in such fashion as to minimize any negative impressions of the Beef industry by the fair going public.
20. There is no guarantee, expressed or implied, by the Great New York State Fair that monies offered by others will be paid.
21. ALL medical sharps or medical waste products MUST be disposed of properly. Medical waste receptacles are available near the wash rack. Do not, under any circumstances, throw sharps in the trash cans, feed bags or bedding. Any exhibitor failing to follow this procedure will automatically forfeit all prize money and will not be allowed to show at the Great New York State Fair for three consecutive years. There will be zero tolerance for such offense.
22. Please do not bring animals or wheelbarrows on the walkway to offices.
23. Not permitted in or around the Barn: Scooters, Skates, Bikes, Skateboards or anything else staff considers a safety issue to the public or cattle.
24. Dogs are not permitted on the Great New York State Fairgrounds and disallow exhibitors from bringing dogs apart from documented service animals. Onondaga County has leash laws and requires that all dogs be leashed.
25. Please do not wean your calves at the Great New York State Fair.
26. Please keep cow and calf pairs together to keep bellowing down and to be respectful to individuals sleeping in the campers.
27. To establish a new show the breed must petition the Superintendent by January 1 of that show year to request a show and must have a show of 15 heads (minimum of 4 exhibitors) for the first

two years. The third year they must have 18 head to continue. Placement of the new show in rotation will be at the discretion of the Superintendent's Office and the Great New York State Fair.

### ***Showring & Ethics***

28. A show number harness must be worn in the show ring. Exhibitors 12 years of age and under may wear hip numbers.
29. Please be advised that all breed rules and regulations will be followed under their division rules. All exhibitors should review these prior to the Great New York State Fair and shows. An example case is semen certificates and/or pregnancy test certificates will be checked.
30. Each breed must provide a person to keep the tally of points for Premium Breeder and Exhibitor Awards, an Announcer and a Ribbon person.
31. For safety reasons Children under 4' will not be allowed to hand out ribbons, banners, awards, etc. in the Show Ring with the cattle.
32. Upon request of the Superintendent of Beef Cattle, exhibitors shall furnish animals to be used in the Youth Judging Contest, parades and media events.
33. Dress Code: Exhibitors will not be allowed to wear farm name apparel while showing, this includes hats.
34. During your show exhibitors are to be in the holding area on time or you may be scratched from the class.
35. Filing protests: If you wish to file a protest regarding the Premier Breeder and Exhibitor award, it must be made in writing within one hour after the award is given. The petition must be submitted in duplicate. The original petition must be given to the Beef Superintendent and the copy to the respective Breed Representative. The Superintendent and Breed Rep will then review the points within 24 hours of the formal protest.
36. An exhibitor may show as many animals in the breeding show as they have entered in the single animal classes but will not receive more than two premiums or ribbons per class. An exhibitor may only show one entry in any group class except: get of sire, junior get of sire and produce of dam. In get of sire, junior get of sire and produce of dam, exhibitor may show as many entries as they have Sires or Dams. Except New York Special – only ONE entry per exhibitor.
37. Any artificial means of removing or remedying physical defects or conformation in exhibition animals will be considered as fraud and deception. All animals giving evidence of such treatment will be barred for exhibition at the Great New York State Fair and at all fairs holding membership in the International Association of Fairs and Expositions. In case any premiums should be awarded to an exhibitor on animals shown in violation of this rule at any fair that is a member of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, the Fair Management, on obtaining conclusive evidence of such violation, will immediately request the exhibitor to refund all premium moneys, cups, trophies, ribbons and banners awarded in violation of this rule. Failure on the part of the exhibitor to comply with this request within 10 days will automatically bar him as an exhibitor from all classes at fairs or exhibitions that are members of the International Association of Fairs and

Expositions and can be reinstated only by a majority vote of the board of directors of said Association. The Secretary of each fair belonging to the International Association of Fairs and Expositions will promptly report all violations of this rule to the secretary of the association who shall notify all members.

38. Association Breed Representatives will not be allowed to change any rule prior to the show. Any changes to rules will be accepted for future shows. All changes must be made to the Superintendent prior to January 1 of Fair year.
39. All bulls born before January 1 of the current year must be always handled on a nose lead or ring when at the Great New York State Fair.
40. No bulls are to be used in any type of showmanship class. This applies to all Open, Breed Association and Youth Showmanship classes.
41. Any animal judged as dangerous to the public must be put on a trailer until it leaves the grounds. Also, in the show ring, an exhibitor will be excused if their animal poses any danger to the other exhibitors or the public.
42. No animals will be passed upon by the judges or awarded a prize whose attendant does not carry or show proper catalogue numbers for the lot exhibiting. For group classes, the catalogue number of the group shall be carried out by the attendant in charge of the group. Exhibitors, please wear catalogue numbers in the front.
43. Cattle prods will not be allowed in or around the barn. Anyone using will be disqualified from their breed shows. Please comply for the welfare of your animals and our visiting public's safety.
44. In all cow calf classes cows must nurse in ring.

### ***Stalling Space & Displays***

45. The Great New York State Fair will provide bark bedding for Beef Cattle exhibitors. Bark bedding is only permitted in the Barn; tie out area may use straw. There is to be no straw bedding to be used in the barn.
46. There will be a designated area for storage of grooming chutes other than in alley ways and cattle stalls, if possible
47. Tie in times are 1st Rotation 8a, 10a Arrival Day for 2nd and 3rd Rotations. 8a for all other days for each Rotation.
48. Tie In Times are 8a every day.
49. Wheelbarrows must be provided by exhibitors to move the manure to the designated area. No manure is to be placed around the outside of the barn area but put into the manure pit that is provided.
50. Generators will not be permitted.
51. Fans used by exhibitors for the livestock, No Butt fans are permitted. Exhibitors are always allowed one fan per three head of cattle during the rotations. Please adhere to this rule, it is for your safety, your fellow exhibitor's safety and our fairgoers.

52. Neck ties and halters must be used on all animals tied in the barn or in the tie-out area. This rule is for the safety of your animals and the safety of the public.

53. Tear down time will be designated by the superintendents per rotation.

**SHORTHORN DIVISION (HORNED AND POLLED)**

**Show Date:** Thursday August 27, 2026, 12:30p

There is no guarantee expressed or implied by the Great New York State Fair that money offered by others will be paid.

**PREMIER EXHIBITOR AND PREMIER BREEDER:** Computed from point system, 3 pts. for first prize, 2 pts. for second prize and 1 pt. for third prize, 3 pts. for Grand Champion and 2 pts. for Reserve Grand Champion. No points for Divisional Champions and Reserve Champions. Group classes included, using the same scoring system.

Points given on 8 head only.

**Tie Breaker:** Exhibitor with the most points won by animals bred and owned in individual class.

***ENTRY IN THIS SHOW BINDS THE EXHIBITOR TO ALL REGULATIONS PERTAINING THERETO.***

Standard Show Classifications

Purebred Shorthorns and/or a Shorthorn Plus that is registered 50% Shorthorn or higher may show together.

In order for an exhibitor to be eligible to receive the American Shorthorn Association's (ASA) share of the premiums at ASA supported shows, the owner's entire herd must be enrolled in the Shorthorn Performance Records (SPR) Program and each animal shown must have individual SPR records.

No exhibitor shall be permitted to win more than two prizes in any one class.

All animals must be registered as the property of the exhibitor in the records of the ASA by the time of the Fair or show.

Individual animals shown in all of the group classes listed below must have been entered and shown in one of the following classes for single animals. Multiple owned animals must be exhibited in the name of all owners.

Family bred and raised animals entered by juniors in Junior Classes and subsequently entered in Open classes may be treated as family entries in group classes.

All Shorthorns and Polled Shorthorns are subject to a tattoo inspection by representatives of the ASA. All Shorthorns and Polled Shorthorns are also subject to an age inspection if deemed necessary by the ASA

and **the decision of the examining veterinarian is final.** Use of artificial fins on show animals is not permitted.

**IMPORTANT:** Each of the following classes **MAY** be broken into multiple classes to accommodate large numbers of entries, but separate classes **MAY NOT** be combined into one. For example, there **MAY** be four “Junior Heifer Calf” classes, but there **MAY NOT** be one single “Spring Heifer Calf” class (combining Late and Early Spring calves).

Entry in this show binds the exhibitor to all regulations pertaining hereto.

### **FEMALE CLASSES**

1. Cow/Calf Class – cow any age – calf born after January 1, 2026. A calf must be cow’s natural calf, not an embryo transplant. Must be registered with the Association prior to show day. The owner of the cow must be the owner or co-owner of calf. Calf may be shown in individual classes. Calf must nurse in ring.

### **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

All animals to be eligible for an Open Charolais Breeding Class must be purebred and registered with the American-International Charolais Association (AICA). Only bona fide (original certificates of registration will be accepted as evidence of registration and ownership. **NO PHOTOCOPIES.**

An animal is eligible to enter or compete in an open Charolais breeding class if registered in country of origin outside the United States and is eligible for purebred registry in the AICA Herd book.

Animals registered in the AICA Colored Division Registry (QF and QM initialed registration numbers) must meet the parameters of the AICA Color Card.

All animals are subject to a medical examination in order to determine age, and each animal will be present in the show ring in its natural conformation without alteration or modification. Use of artificial tailheads is not permitted.

Any animal not having a legible tattoo or firebrand number is ineligible and will be barred from showing.

**NURSE COWS ARE NOT PERMITTED.**

**Cow-Calf:** Calf must be cow's natural calf, not embryo transplant. Calf to be no more than 250 days of age by day of show. Calf must be purebred and registered with the AICA. No age restriction on the cow. Cow and/or Calf may be included in group class entries as an individual not as pair compromising a single animal entry.

Cow/calf pairs are not eligible for Grand or Reserve Champion Female as a separate Grand and Reserve Champion Heifer is set aside for Cow/Calf.

Calves apart of a Cow/Calf pair can be shown in individual age-appropriate classes.

AICA requires that all animals be shown with a halter and suggest that all bulls be shown with nose lead.

Article XV, Paragraph 8, Point 2: "Each animal will be present in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical, or other (including banding or other circulatory construction) appearance change for cosmetic purposes, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. The act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method per (by esophagus) is prohibited. Silicone injection or other injection for cosmetic purpose shall be prohibited. Anabolic steroid use shall likewise be prohibited and any animal testing positive for anabolic steroid or diuretic use shall be presumed to be altered and modified."

All Rules and Regulations apply including those set forth by the Great New York State Fair.

PREMIER BREEDER and PREMIER EXHIBITOR awards will be given on the point system as follows:

3 pts. for 1st prize; 2 pts. for 2nd prize and 1 pt. for 3rd prize. 3 pts. for Grand Champion and 2 pts. for Reserve Grand Champion NO points for Divisional Champions or Reserve Champions. Points will be given on eight head only. Group Classes included, using the same scoring system.

Tie Breaker: Exhibitor with the most points won by animals bred and owned in individual classes.

### **RULES & REGULATIONS**

All animals must be registered in the American Hereford Association or American Polled Hereford Assoc.; original registration certificates must be presented upon request of Show Officials or AHA Staff.

Animals must be entered and exhibited under the recorded ownership name or co-owners' names as of show entry deadline date. Ear tattoos must be legible and correct for show eligibility.

Violation of AHA's rules regarding defects and unethical practices will result in disqualification of animals in question.

All other rules of this Show apply.

These rules are specific and clear. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to make himself familiar with them. They must be complied with.

## **GENERAL RULES**

**A. RECORD OF REGISTRY:** Registration in the American Hereford Association is required of all Herefords owned by and to be exhibited by American breeders, whether the animals were domestically produced or of foreign origin. Herefords originating outside the United States and owned by breeders living outside the USA must be registered in the recognized herd or stud book of the country of origin and recognized by the American Hereford Association or registered in the AHA.

**B. REGISTRATION CERTIFICATES:** Exhibitors are required to have AHA original registration certificates of the animals on exhibit, in possession of the herdsman with the cattle. Similarly, in cases of animals originating from outside the USA and owned by breeders outside the USA, official registration certificates from country of origin are required. It is required that original registration certificates be current and accurate with regard to the animal's recorded ownership as of the show's entry deadline date. Original registration certificates are to be made available on request to staff.

**REGISTRATION STATUS:** Application for registration must be on file with AHA by that specific show's entry deadline date for an animal to be eligible for that specific show.

**IDENTIFICATION BY TATTOO:** Ear tattoos must be clearly legible and agree with animal's registration certificate. Any animal whose tattoos do not match the registration certificate is ineligible to be exhibited in that show at which detection is made.

**OWNERSHIP:** Cattle must be entered and exhibited under recorded ownership as of the show's entry deadline date. (See Rule "G" also.)

**NEW OWNERS:** Transfers of ownership must be on file in the AHA office no later than the show's entry deadline date.

**JOINTLY OWNED ANIMALS:** Jointly owned animals must be entered and exhibited under joint ownership in the individual heifer and bull classes.

## **H. GROUP CLASSES:**

Jointly owned animals must be shown in Group Classes by one of the co-owners under his banner or may be shown in this class under the joint ownership if all animals are owned alike.

Common ownership of all four animals in the Get-of-Sire Classes is not required; they may be solely owned or jointly owned by different breeder-exhibitors, but get-of-sire entry may be entered/exhibited in the name of only one herd.

I. DEFECTS AND UNETHICAL PRACTICES: The following are considered defects and unethical practices. Any violation of the rules regarding these will result in disqualification of the animal in question:

Removing, trimming or tampering with scurs, or any animal that is not a naturally polled animal.

Cutting out, dyeing or otherwise tampering with any white hairs, constituting what is known as a lineback on the back of any animal.

Application of hair or artificial foundation in any area of the animal to alter the appearance of the natural lines of structure of the animal.

Application of dye or coloring to hair of any animal in any area of its body that would change natural color or color marking/pattern of animal.

J. SIFTING: All cattle entered for show may be inspected and required to meet minimum standards of type, quality and conformation.

K. BEST SIX HEAD: Exhibitors who make entries in the Best Six Head Class are required to lead out in this class, or forfeit their premium money, providing they have at least six animals in the event.

L. SENIOR YEARLING HEIFERS: In shows after January 1, senior yearling age heifers (calved Aug. 1-Dec. 31) are required to be exhibited in show ring competition with their own natural calf (not embryo transplant) at foot.

M. CALVES SHOWN WITH DAMS: A calf exhibited in show ring competition with its dam, in any class, is eligible to compete in an individual calf class by itself in the same show, and vice versa.

**PREMIER BREEDER and PREMIER EXHIBITOR**

Points given on eight head only.

Awarded with the following point system – 1st place = 5 points, 2nd place = 4 points, 3rd place = 3 points, 4th place = 2 points and 5th place = 1 point. No points will be given to the champions. Points will be awarded for the Get of Sire and Best Six Head for Premier Exhibitor ONLY.

It is suggested that banners be given to the Premier Exhibitor and Premier Breeder.

Tie Breaker: Exhibitor with the most points won by animals bred and owned in individual classes.

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS: Effective July 1, 2004, at any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited.

The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated make up areas.

The Simmental classes are open to all duly REGISTERED 87.5% (Purebred) and above animals of the American Simmental Association or the Canadian Simmental Association. (Less than purebred registered Simmental need to show in All Other Breeds Show) All females & males must have an official original registration certificate. All females entered in class.

583 are required to have a certificate from a licensed veterinarian stating that the female is safe in calf prior to the show date or have a letter from an embryo transplant facility stating that she has produced viable embryos prior to show date or have a natural calf at side. All animals must be registered as the property of the exhibitor in the records of the American Simmental Association or Canadian Simmental Association as evidenced by the ORIGINAL REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE. Jointly owned animals must be entered and shown under the multi-ownership (all co-owners) in individual classes, and for the purposes of calculating Premier Exhibitor and Premier Breeder, the points are attributable to the multi-ownership (all co-owners) not to the individual co-owners. In the group classes, jointly owned animals may be entered and exhibited under the name of one of the co-owners provided he owns a full or part interest in each of the animals in the group entry. Individual animals shown in all group classes listed below, except the Cow-Calf Class, must have been entered and shown in one of the following classes for individual animals. For group classes, except the Get-of-Sire Class and Produce of Dam, all individual animals making up a group entry must be owned or co-owned by the exhibitor and each exhibitor can only have one entry in each group class (other than Get & Produce). There is no ownership requirement for Get-of-Sire Class or Produce of Dam Class. The Get-of-Sire Class shall be in the name of the sire, not the exhibitor(s). Family members' animals registered in a junior member's name and entered in the open show may be treated as family entries in the group classes, if the Junior member is 21 years of age and under as of January 1st of that year. For Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor points, an exhibitor will be considered a junior member and their family as one, as explained above. Two-year-old Cow/Calf and Aged Cow/Calf classes must have natural suckling calf at side. Calf status (Purebred or Percentage) determines if pair is shown in Purebred or Percentage Show. Calf must be born on or after January 1, 2025, Calf can be shown individually. Any age cow in the aged cow/calf classes.

#### PREMIER BREEDER & EXHIBITOR

A Premier Exhibitor Banner will be awarded to the exhibitor accumulating the most points on animals (not to exceed 10 head) exhibited by him and shown in individual classes. A Premier Breeder Banner will be awarded to the breeder accumulating the most points on animals bred by him and shown in the individual classes. Points for Premier Exhibitor and Premier Breeder shall be calculated as follows: First, second and third place animals in each class will receive one point for each animal IN THE CLASS, up to a maximum of 9 points to 1st, 8 points to 2nd place and 7 points to 3rd place. (For example: A first-place winner in a class of six shall receive 6 points – first place winner in a class of one will receive 1 point.) Grand Champion shall receive 5 points; Reserve Grand Champion, 4 points; Division Champions, 3 points; and Reserve Division Champions, 2 points. In the event of a tie, the number of points shall be

divided by the number of animals the points were derived from and the exhibitor/breeder having the higher point average shall be presented the award. Steers are included in the points.
